Business Set-up, Transfer and Closure Inquiry

We refer to the previous submissions made by ARITA to the Productivity Commission in relation to this inquiry and make the following supplementary submission for your reference.

The Commission's draft report dated May 2015 includes a draft recommendation that the Corporations Act 2001 should be amended to provide for a simplified 'small liquidation' process (draft recommendation 15.5) consistent with ARITA's model for streamlined liquidations as referred to in the report.

ARITA recognises a need for comprehensive research across the profession to ascertain the existing and anticipated costs of liquidation under the current and proposed simplified processes. We will be undertaking this research and anticipate it will completed in the next six months.
