About Us

MortarCAPS Higher Learning Data Standard (MCDS) is the **first unified Commonwealth data standard, built by the sector, for the sector.** It supports interoperability, AI readiness, and cross-border student mobility.

With over **70 institutions** across Australia, New Zealand, and Canada contributing, MCDS is helping modernise tertiary education by:

- **Skills Alignment with Industry Needs**
 - Embedding skills and competencies into learning to meet evolving labour market demands, including microcredentials and work-integrated learning.
- **Digital Transformation & Interoperability**
 - Streamlining data systems, investing in edtech, AI, and automation, and enabling portability of credentials across systems and borders.
- **Lifelong Learning & Access Pathways**
 - Supporting learner mobility, credit transfer, and upskilling/reskilling across all stages of life.
- **Equity, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI)**
 - Addressing barriers to participation and success for underrepresented groups.
- **Sustainability & Resilience**
 - Enabling environmental and financial sustainability while future-proofing against geopolitical, technological, and demographic change.

Funded by software vendors—not institutions—MCDS offers a future-focused foundation to drive productivity, collaboration, and student success at scale.

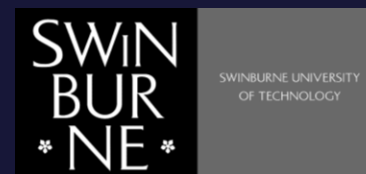

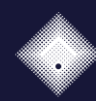

MCDS provides the foundation to **finally address sector and national priorities** — from skills alignment and learner mobility to equity and workforce productivity — while **preparing institutions for an AI-enabled future** through consistent, interoperable data.

The Challenge & Solution

Skills Alignment with Industry Needs

- **Challenge:**
Learning outcomes and qualifications are not consistently mapped to real-world skills, making it hard for employers to understand graduate capability and for institutions to respond quickly to workforce needs.
- **MCDS Solution:**
MCDS embeds structured, machine-readable skills and competencies into credential records, enabling alignment with national and international skills frameworks and making it easier to adapt curriculum to industry demand.

Learner Mobility and Credit Portability

- **Challenge:**
Transitions between VET and higher education, or across institutions, are administratively complex, inconsistent, and often disadvantage learners—especially those from underrepresented backgrounds.
- **MCDS Solution:**
MCDS standardises enrolment, credit, and credential data, supporting seamless credit transfer, and stackable credentials that move with the learner across sectors and borders.

National Productivity and Workforce Planning

- **Challenge:**
Policymakers and institutions lack consistent, real-time visibility into skills supply, educational attainment, and credentialing activity—undermining national productivity, migration, and workforce strategies.
- **MCDS Solution:**
MCDS provides a harmonised data layer that links learning to skills and employment outcomes, enabling government, industry, and education to collaborate on strategic, evidence-based planning.





The Challenge & Solution

Equity and Access to Lifelong Learning

- **Challenge:**
The current system favours full qualifications and traditional pathways, limiting access for learners needing flexible, bite-sized, or re-entry education options.
- **MCDS Solution:**
MCDS supports the recognition and portability of microcredentials and partial qualifications, reducing entry barriers and enabling inclusive, lifelong, skills-based learning models.

Digital Transformation and AI Readiness

- **Challenge:**
Legacy systems, siloed platforms, and lack of common architecture prevent institutions from realising the benefits of digital infrastructure, automation, and AI.
- **MCDS Solution:**
MCDS provides a future-proof, open standard designed for interoperability across student systems, credential platforms, and government databases—accelerating transformation and innovation.

Cost Efficiency and Cross-Sector Collaboration

- **Challenge:**
Institutions are duplicating effort and spending on custom data fixes, bespoke reports, and one-off integrations—with limited opportunities to pool resources or scale solutions.
- **MCDS Solution:**
MCDS is governed by the sector and funded by vendors, enabling shared infrastructure, standardised reporting, and cross-sector coordination—reducing cost and complexity at scale.

What is Open Banking?

- A government-led initiative that lets consumers safely share their banking data with other banks and apps to get better deals and more personalised services.

Why Do Data Standards Matter?

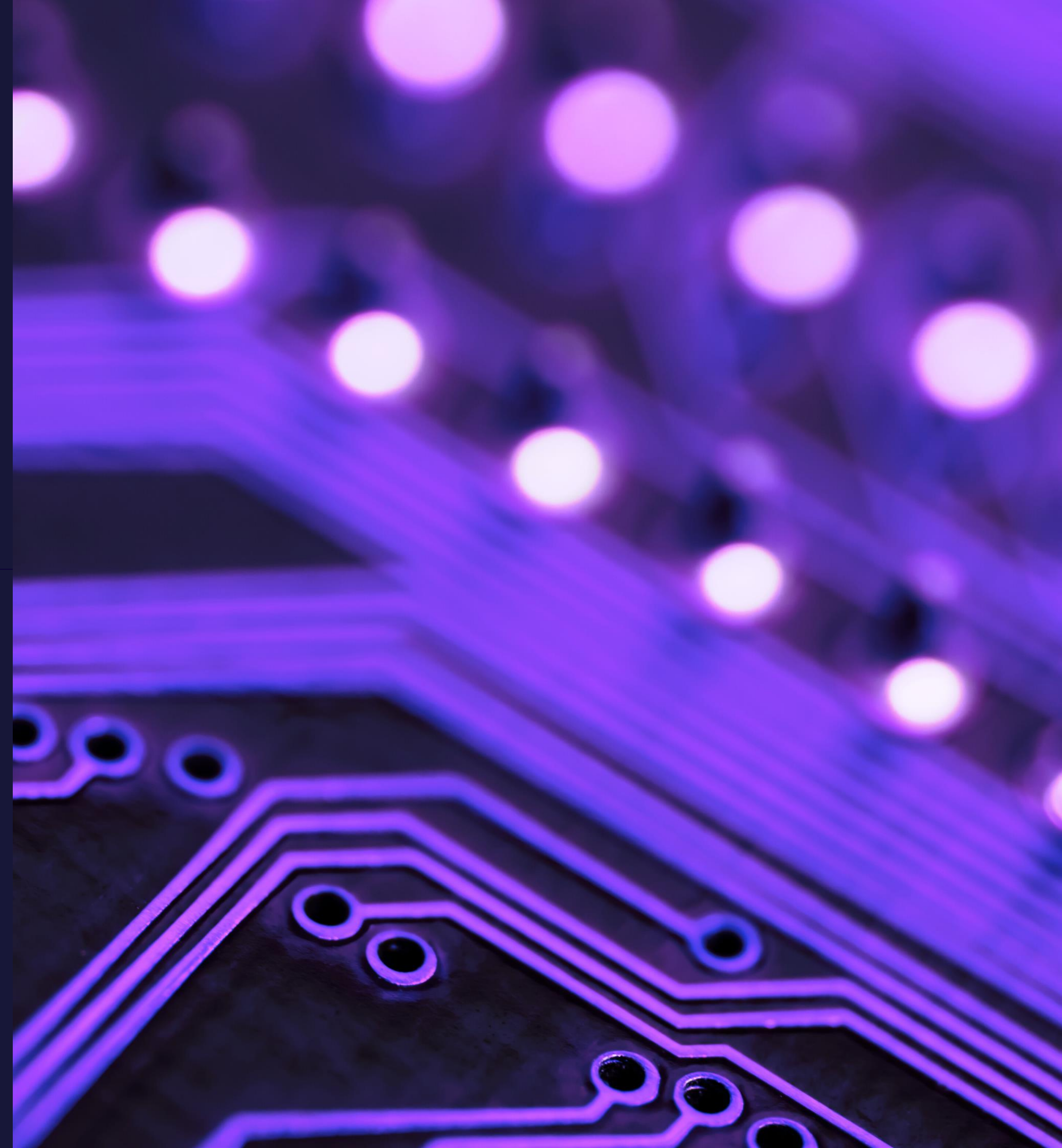
- Everyone uses the same “language” to share information, which makes it fast, accurate, and secure.
- Standards make sure data flows smoothly between systems, even if they’re run by different companies.

What This Means for Consumers:

- **Easier switching** between banks or providers
- **Smarter tools** to manage money, savings, or credit
- **More control** over who sees their data and for what purpose

What This Means for the Sector:

- Reduces costs and duplication of effort & data
- Encourages innovation by new players
- Increases trust in digital services



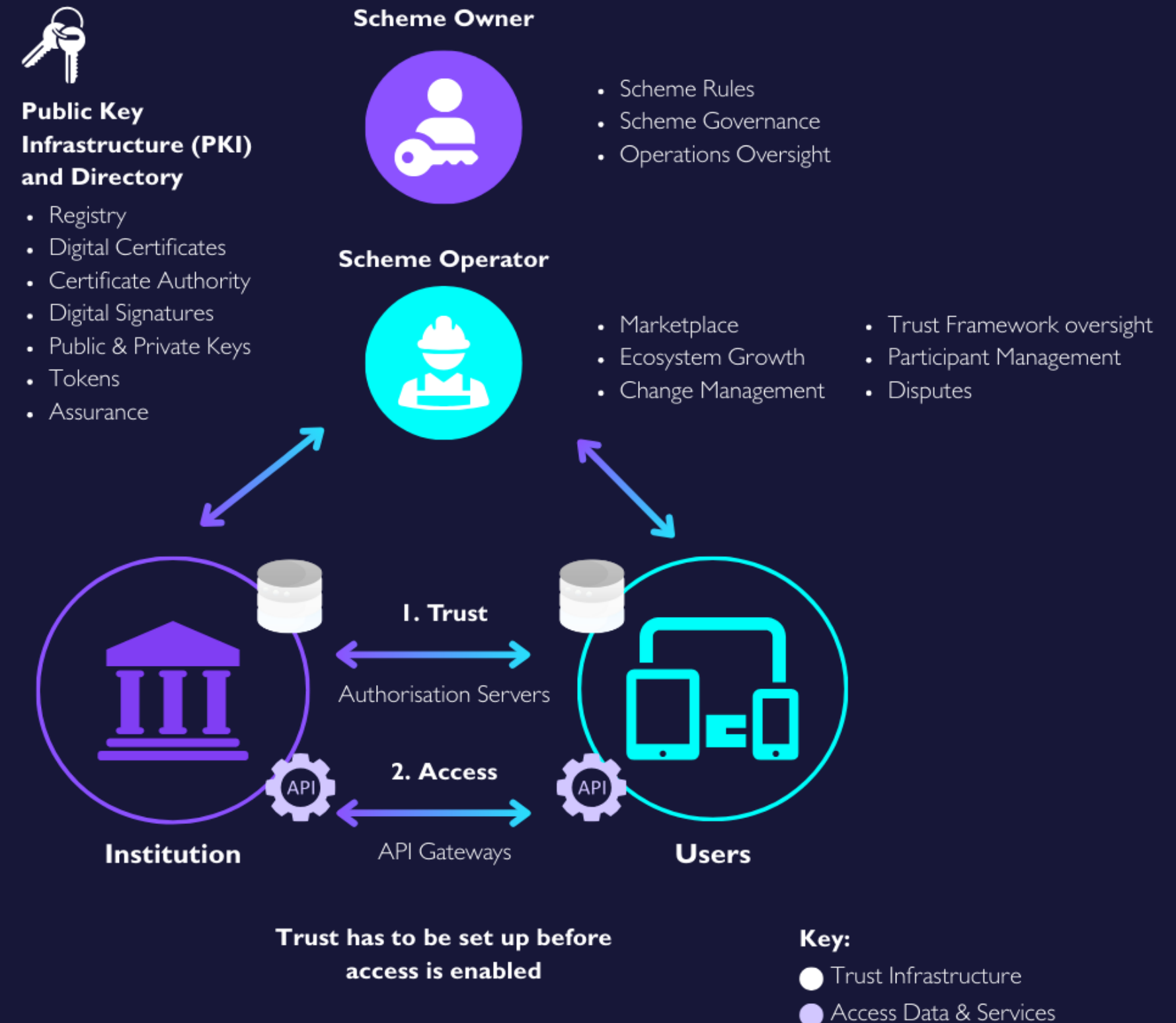


Future Vision Open Education

Before one institution can securely and privately access a student's data and services in another institution, digital and commercial "Trust" needs to be set up between the two.

In this model, Open Education will use the secure encryption of Public Key Infrastructure to maintain secure, private data exchange between **Data Providers** and **Data Consumers**.

This system allows for more than just transcript data to be shifted securely – enabling the wellbeing and support services data also to remain in the student's hands.





Protecting Data and System Security

- **Privacy by Design:**
 - The system is built to keep personal learning data secure and under the learner's control.
- **Student-Owned Data:**
 - Just like with Open Banking, students decide who can access or use their data — not institutions or companies.
- **No Central Database:**
 - Data is decentralised and flows securely between verified systems using encrypted standards.
- **Government-Backed Frameworks:**
 - Security, access, and consent rules are designed with strong public oversight.
- **Built for Trust:**
 - The scheme builds confidence in the digital learning economy by putting citizens first — protecting identity, history, and choice.

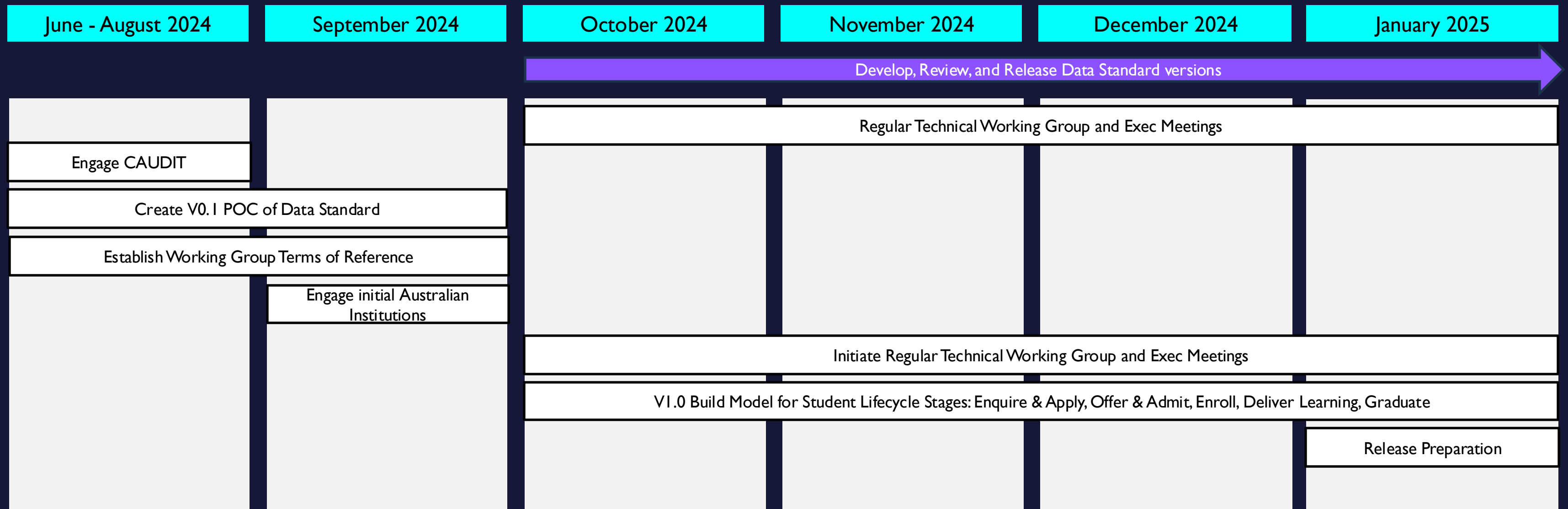

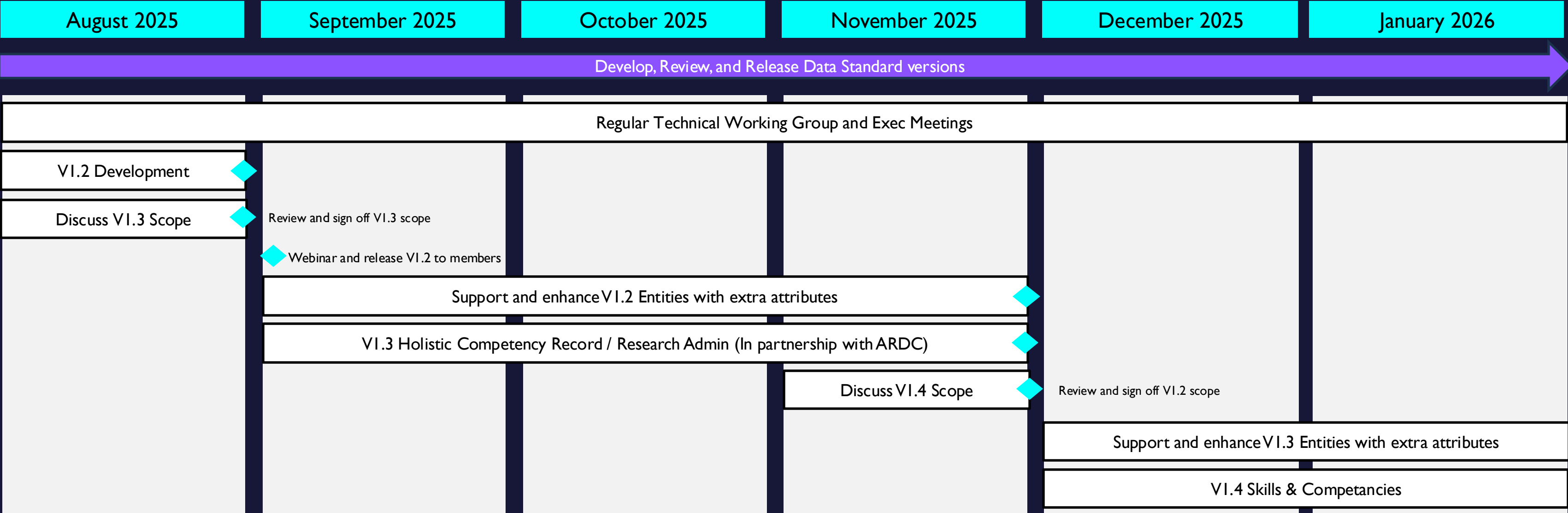
