Urban water

- No consistent definition and measurement for water security nationally
- Not able to discuss all options with community

Hard to embed liveablity outcomes and integrated water management

Committing to financial resilience to support high investment needs

Other national challenges:

- Regional capacity and capability
- Indigenous and remote services
- Research and innovation

Remove roadblocks to ensure better outcomes for customers

Providing collective agreement and focus on key priorities

Depoliticising sensitive issues when all jurisdictions agree to pursue action collectively

Creating a long-term focus to overcome short term barriers

Creating accountability and transparency for agreed outcomes

Providing incentives as a catalyst for reform that would not occur in individual jurisdictions
