You are not encouraged to work past 65 as the tax department claims most of your rewards for good service to your employer, so why be conned into thinking you are helping out your country and sharing your expertise with younger employees.

A redundancy thank you payment is stolen from you at the full tax rate which in turn prevents claiming dependents and you get wacked a massive medicare levee to boot, hence your final hand shake is mostly taken by the government departments and of no benefit to you for your loyal and trustworthy lifetime service.

America and Germany protect and maintain their vital roles.

Australia was able to do this to some degree in WW2 to provide machines for man to defend their own nation. Without the skilled people we do not stand a chance.

When this happens no doubt the Liberal govt will hand over to a Labor govt who are people

skills orientated and understand how to value you people rather than money driven values.

The structure for operation is the Improvement Wheel.

The car manufacturing business and valued "all star" staff are located in the wheel hub.

Some lubrication of grease input from govt from time to time is required to keep things going when the terrain gets tough.

The outsourced suppliers form the spokes of the wheel and the community forms the outer rim on their journey with the company

Using the two key trick with locked car it will start the petrol engine if volts goes too low and recharge the batteries in a few moments then shut down ready for start up in the morning to drive to work. Driving recharge only takes 10 minutes as you use electric on the way to work as well.

Who would think you could have a car in your shed that could do several roles and help the environment at the same time.

Holden volt consumes power from the grid so they have the concept back to front when it comes to being a versatile product for the customer. Maybe they need to re think what their market looks like and is it relevant like the Toyota that can be very versatile for its capital outlay and excite the customer. My vehicle has traveled over 80.000 kms and provided admirable service, doing a lot more than the environmental lobby understand in their product evaluations via their limited vision.

The possibilities are there, why not explore them to make your sales and cost budgets whilst creating more employment for specialist employees to install and service.

In the overall plan some things perform better than others in return for investment but a portfolio usually has these levels of risk versus outcomes.

You cannot grow crops without water and the water system can be very inefficient, but ways can be found all round to improve the crop outcomes with some creative thinking outside the box.

Methods of water collection/extraction and delivery, onsite distribution methods to plant root zone depth with out waste,

crop improvements and harvesting techniques leading to end product versatile uses making the whole process a worth while challenge.

Unless we all band together and create our own investment trade bank as suggested in the Australia Reconstructed Program we will have to rely on companies looking for opportunities to improve their bottom line for shareholders to invest in our nation. The loss of our skilled people for now and in the future will be a major blow to training and development issues across the nation.

The mining industry will be absorbing only the young employees and casting many senior workers to the employment scrap heap and onto the national assistance schemes.
