I believe the proposed changes have the potential to:

- Undermine our ability to create Australian children's literature and support emerging authors and illustrator
- Threaten our ability for cultural expression by removing our distinctive Australian voice and place
- Reduce Australian print runs
- Reduce publisher interest in mentoring new creators
- Allow dumping here of international editions of Australian books
- Limit income to creators
- Encourage interest in the 'blockbuster' and diminish interest in other works
- Cause the loss of jobs in the printing and publishing industry and all associated trades.

I believe the 30-day rule works well to modify our territorial copyright and help both booksellers and consumers access books at reasonable prices. It's a sensible modification to the international rules.

I do not believe we should change those rules even further, lest we find ourselves mere spectators on someone else's level playing field.



We must not unilaterally surrender our territorial copyright.
