Learning Logic Publishing continue to be opposed to the draft recommendations of the Productivity Commission.

The recommendations would be unworkable and destructive in operation, and are not based on hard, verifiable evidence.

Our business of publishing education materials to assist children to read and write – one of the most important skills children need – would be at risk.

The Productivity Commission's central recommendation — limiting the life of Australian territorial copyright to only 12 months — pretends to retain territorial contract while setting up conditions that would undermine and cripple it as well as do great harm to all involved in the Australian book industry, including consumers.

Learning Logic Publishing remains opposed to any form of removal or erosion of the current territorial copyright regime.
