We are best described as an aspirant broadcaster and community interest group.

Coraki is on the Far North Coast of NSW, just South of Lismore.

My main motivation for this submission is so that the opinions of tiny community stations who are not members of the CBAA will not be regarded as small change. We are a tiny, very poor but successful community station.

Unfortunately the CBAA has become an elitist group of full-time licensed major stations, who have little time for the new kids on the blocks, especially the back-blocks.

Successive State and Federal Governments of both persuasions have similarly abandoned rural Australia, as have most national associations with the exception of Farmers' groups.

Your inquiry has the opportunity to ensure that broadcasting legislation, where it needs to and is able to, addresses the social and economic deprivations of rural Australia. The culture is no longer Sydney or the Bush - it's Sydney versus the Bush.
