My name is Gary Samuels. My wife is afflicted with disease called Multiple Sclerosis, diagnosed in the mid 1990's. I have 2 adult children who are now living independently. I am currently receiving carer payment and carer allowance and my wife receives a Disability Allowance. I am writing to support the National Disability Insurance Scheme and would like to raise some of the issues that I believe are relevant to this debate.

As a brief background I have over 30 years experience as a health clinician/administrator. I have been both a union shop steward and manager in the health system and have both experience and good communication skills. I had no idea at the outset how difficult the health and welfare systems would be to negotiate and I feel completed abandoned. I regret that I did not heed the warnings provided by my wife's Neurologist when he informed me how hopeless the health and welfare systems were in Australia.

- 1. Since my wife became ill I have not had a holiday with my family and have on maybe 2 occasions been away from her for over 24 hours.
- 2. As a result of my requirement to provide full time care my employment was terminated by the Health Network that employed me.
- 3. I will probably lose my Nursing Registration this year
- 4. My wife's condition continues to deteriorate yet what services I can find to assist us are short term or being withdrawn. Family supports are negligible.
- 5. The focus of support is to the carer. I can have counselling. Respite is never available.
- 6. My wife has never had a health assessment and therefore there is no proper plan for her
- 7. My wife has a care plan with her General Practitioner that has been helpful to relieve some of the financial burden.
- 8. Superannuation offered no disability assistance
- 9. The financial and social impact upon my family has been devastating
- 10. If we had access to a Disability Insurance Scheme my family would not have been forced to endure the humiliation and isolation that resulted from this terrible disease.
- 11. If I began to earn and income I would lose all access to the support services I currently receive.
- 12. If you have ever read the novel "Catch 22" it describes our Health and Welfare systems perfectly.
