Thank you for the opportunity to provide a submission to the Productivity Commission's Gambling Inquiry.

Key Facts

The CEX Group of Clubs comprises 3 venues, the main Club at Coffs Harbour (Coffs Ex-Services Club) along with the Urunga Golf and Sports Club and the Woolgoolga Bowling Club.

- 1997 Stage II Reception, Entertainment Lounge & Garden Bar opened

- 2007 Vista Lounge refurbishment, Urunga Golf Club amalgamation
- 2008 Al fresco gaming lounge opened

Economic Contribution

The CEX Group employs 212 employees and generates an annual wage bill in excess of \$7 mil each year. The CEX Group is one of the top 10 employers in the Coffs Harbour region.

Payment to supplier, both local and others, amounts to over \$20 mil per annum and the Group in 2008/09 will have spent over \$4.5 mil on capital works projects employing local contractors and suppliers.

The CEX Group will have paid over \$5.2 mil in taxes for the 2008/09 year including:

GST	\$475,000
Payroll Tax	\$400,000
Other Taxes	\$185,000

Poker machine services account for over 61% of the CEX Group's combined revenue, with our food services and functions generating 15% and Bar services 18%.

Social Contribution

We are the largest organization in the Coffs Harbour region and have been supporting local charities and sporting groups for over 50 years. The Club in partnership with the Coffs Harbour City Council played an integral part in providing the infrastructure necessary for the development of Southern Cross University Education facility for the Coffs Harbour and surrounding communities.

For the year ended 31 August 2008 the Club provided financial support of \$357,000 to local sporting, community development and support programs.

In particular the following organizations received cash donations in excess of \$5000.
