These reports demonstrate the extent to which places of work are contaminated by ETS, not only where smoking is permitted by special exemption, but in areas where smoking is prohibited, and in adjacent premises, with consequent health risks in the short term and the long term.

Under Occupational Health and Safety, smoking should be prohibited in all areas and at all times. Monitoring should be required if breaches or a drift of tobacco smoke from outside are suspected.
