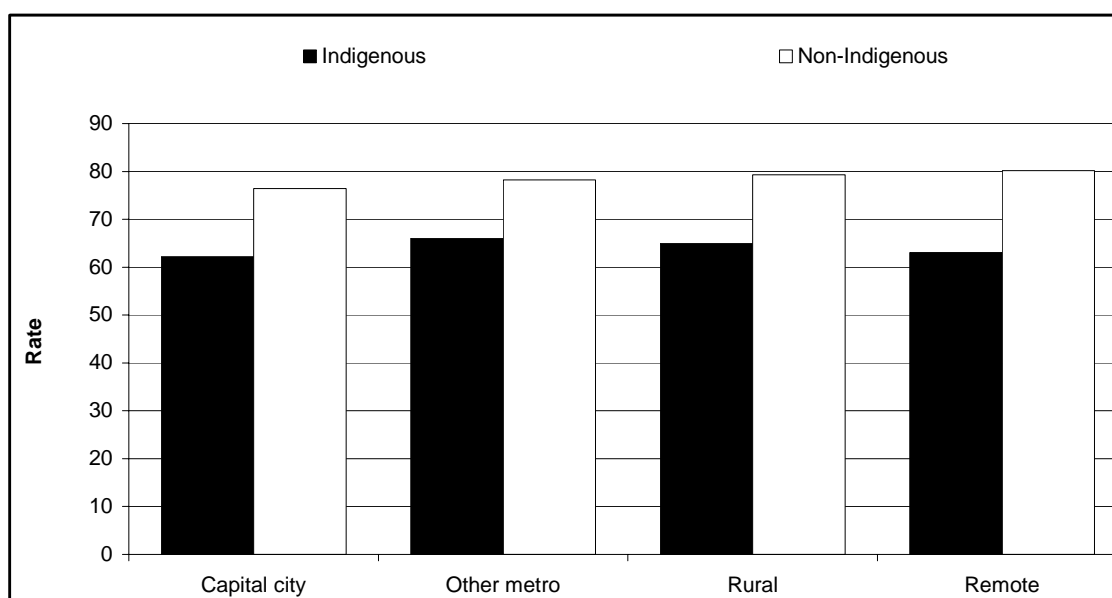

Errata – Report on Overcoming Indigenous Disadvantage: Key Indicators 2003
